

RSU Utility Model Registrations Boost Livelihood Solutions for Farmers and Micro-Entrepreneurs

The registration of RSU's new utility models strengthens the university's role in promoting technologies that uplift local livelihoods and support income-generating opportunities. The Rice Field Paddies Water Level Monitoring Apparatus offers small-scale farmers a practical tool to improve productivity and reduce risks in rice production, helping stabilize earnings in rural communities. Meanwhile, the Method of Producing Herbal Candy presents a simple yet marketable innovation that can be adopted by micro-enterprises, women's groups, and local producers seeking additional income sources. By opening these technologies for commercialization and community use, RSU contributes to expanding economic opportunities and supporting efforts that reduce the financial vulnerability of households.

RSU forges International Partnership with Dalhousie University to Advance Smart Agriculture

Romblon State University strengthened its commitment to SDG 2 through the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding with Dalhousie University – Faculty of Agriculture on July 19, 2024. The partnership aims to advance smart agriculture initiatives, integrating technology-driven approaches that enhance productivity, sustainability, and food security across the province of Romblon. By leveraging international expertise, RSU is positioning itself as a leader in modern agricultural innovation in MIMAROPA. This collaboration expands RSU's capability to support local farmers and communities through research, training, and the development of resilient agricultural practices. Through this international agreement, RSU deepens its role in promoting sustainable food systems and empowering agricultural stakeholders—demonstrating how global partnerships can generate meaningful local impact in the pursuit of Zero Hunger.

MIMAROPA Region, October 3, 2024 – The Department of Agriculture – Special Area for Agricultural Development (DA – SAAD) MIMAROPA, in partnership with Romblon State University (RSU) and the Farm and Fisheries Clustering and Consolidation (F2C2) MIMAROPA, trained 895 farmers across the region through a series of Marketing Assistance and Enterprise Development (MAED) workshops.

ADMINISTRATION

RSU Strengthens Farmer Capacity through Enterprise Development Training with DA-SAAD and F2C2

Romblon State University showed strong administrative leadership in advancing SDG 2 through its partnership with DA-SAAD MIMAROPA and F2C2 MIMAROPA for the Marketing Assistance and Enterprise Development workshops. Conducted on October 3, 2024, the initiative equipped 895 farmers with essential skills in marketing, enterprise development, and organizational management to strengthen their agricultural operations.

By coordinating inter-agency efforts and mobilizing institutional support, RSU helped farmers improve production systems, expand market access, and move toward sustainable community-based enterprises. This collaborative effort reflects RSU's commitment to food security and rural development across the region.

RESEARCH

RSU Research Experts Lead Capability-Building for Organic Farming Development

Romblon State University advanced its research engagement under SDG 2 by conducting a capability-building training for the Toctoc Organic Farmers Association on October 8, 2024 in partnership with the SAAD Program Phase 2. The sessions delivered by RSU experts were grounded in research-based practices on organizational management, strategic planning, and sustainable agricultural development, enabling farmers to analyze production challenges and apply evidence-informed solutions.

Through this initiative, RSU translated academic knowledge and research outputs into practical capacity-building for local farmers. By integrating research concepts into training activities, the university strengthened the ability of agricultural communities to adopt improved systems, enhance productivity, and support long-term food security in the region.

Organized by the RSU Health Services Unit, the event emphasized the university’s dedication to protecting youth health, promoting informed decision-making, and advocating for reproductive rights. 

RESEARCH

RSU Develops Research-Based Portable Device for Hyperhidrosis Relief

Romblon State University advanced its health research initiatives under SDG 3 through the development of the HULAS-LUNAS TECH: Portable Iontophoresis Apparatus, an innovative device designed to treat hyperhidrosis of the hands and feet. Backed by research trials showing 88.89 percent effectiveness within 2 to 4 weeks, the project demonstrates RSU's commitment to producing scientifically validated solutions that improve comfort, confidence, and quality of life. Protected by both Industrial Design and Utility Model registrations, the device reflects RSU's growing capacity for health-centered R&D and technology innovation. By translating research into practical tools that address real medical needs, the university contributes meaningfully to advancing good health, well-being, and accessible therapeutic options for the community.

RSU Community Blood Drive Supports Regional Health Needs

Romblon State University strengthened its commitment to SDG 3 through a community blood donation drive held on October 3, 2024, in partnership with local health agencies. The activity collected 31 bags of blood from students, staff, and President Merian P. Catajay-Mani, helping sustain the region's vital blood supply. With medical professionals from the Red Cross, RHU, PHO, DOH, and other partners ensuring safe procedures, the initiative showcased RSU's dedication to public health, volunteerism, and community well-being. 

RSU earns Best Paper and Best Presenter Awards in International Education Research Conference

Romblon State University strengthened its SDG 4 research commitments through the outstanding achievements of Dr. Garry Vanz Blanca at the 15th International Conference on Education, Environment, and Agriculture held on October 17–18, 2024. His study on AI literacy, computational thinking, and organizational agility earned both Best Presenter and Best Paper awards in the Education category.

This recognition highlights RSU's growing leadership in educational research and innovation, demonstrating the university's contribution to advancing knowledge, promoting digital skills, and supporting high-quality, future-ready education.

With insights from CHED MIMAROPA and RSU resource speakers, the activity enhanced faculty capacity to deliver inclusive and equitable instruction. This milestone reflects RSU's commitment to gender-responsive education and its continued effort to foster learning environments that uphold equality, respect, and empowerment.

RSU Elevates Gender Inclusivity Through “Kulayaan: Gabi it Pagkilaya” Recognition Event

Romblon State University advanced its SDG 5 administrative commitments by hosting “Kulayaan: Gabi it Pagkilaya” on March 21, 2024, the university's first formal recognition program honoring outstanding members of the LGBTQ+ community. Organized by the Gender and Development Office, the event gathered university leaders, GAD advocates, and local officials to celebrate achievements across public service, education, youth leadership, sports, arts, and media. Through speeches of solidarity, cultural performances, and an awards ceremony led by President Merian P. Catajay-Mani, RSU underscored its institutional dedication to equality, safe spaces, and inclusive governance. With Kulayaan now declared an annual tradition, RSU strengthens its administrative commitment to gender-responsive policies and a culture that uplifts and empowers all identities.

RESEARCH

RSU Conducts Needs Assessment and Exploratory Meeting with Panagintingan and Layag IP Communities

Organized by the RSU Extension Services and Community Engagement Office (ESCEO), in partnership with the Gender and Development (GAD) Office and RSU Cajidiocan and San Fernando Campus, a four-day Needs Assessment and Exploratory Meeting with the Panagintingan and Layag Indigenous Peoples communities was held on November 19–22, 2024. The activity gathered around 75 community members and 20 IP leaders to systematically assess their current conditions, challenges, available resources, and priority needs. Through guided discussions and participatory data gathering, the team identified key issues and potential interventions that will inform evidence-based planning under the UNI-CESSS v.2 program. This initiative strengthens RSU's commitment to inclusive, community-driven development and supports the formulation of research-backed programs that uphold gender sensitivity, cultural respect, and sustainable progress.

RSU Promotes Awareness on HIV, STI Prevention, and Violence Against Women Through Joint Campaign

RSU strengthened its advocacy for gender equality and safety through a Joint Awareness Campaign on HIV/AIDS and Violence Against Women on December 6. Over 580 students and staff learned about HIV prevention, reproductive health, VAWC laws, and the forms of abuse affecting women and youth. The activity, led by the Health Services Office with support from RHU, GCSO, and GAD, highlighted RSU's commitment to building an informed, protected, and gender-responsive community. This initiative reinforces the university's mission to empower students through awareness, protection, and responsible decision-making.


Clean Water and Sanitation

RSU Hosts Waterwise Expo 2024 to Strengthen Education on Sustainable Water Management

Romblon State University advanced SDG 6 by hosting the Waterwise Expo 2024 in partnership with Isabela State University and Kyoto University. The event gathered students, faculty, and researchers to learn about innovative and science-based approaches to water resource management, disaster prevention, and SMART water infrastructure. With expert talks from ISU's SWIM-NICER Center and Kyoto University, the expo enhanced academic understanding of sustainable water systems. Through this knowledge-sharing activity, RSU reinforced its instructional commitment to integrating global best practices into its teaching and learning environment. The expo empowered RSU students and educators with new insights, encouraged interdisciplinary discussions, and strengthened the University's role in promoting sustainable, resilient, and community-responsive water management solutions.

RSU Strengthens Institutional Ties with ISU to Advance Water Governance and Innovation

Romblon State University strengthened its administrative efforts for SDG 6 by formalizing a partnership with Isabela State University (ISU) on joint research, capacity-building, and academic exchange. RSU, Kyoto University Explore Partnership for Water Research and Innovation

Romblon State University strengthened its research commitment to SDG 6 through an inception meeting with Kyoto University on December 1, 2024. Hosted by Prof. Sameh Ahmed Kantoush of the Disaster Prevention Research Institute, the discussion focused on potential collaboration in water resource management, disaster risk reduction, and sustainable development. Dr. Eddie G. Fetalvero, together with RSU faculty and PhD student Engr. Jerome Gacu, represented the university.

The meeting also connected RSU with Filipino scholars from JICA, DOST, DPWH, and MMSU, reinforcing a shared vision for impactful water research and capacity building. This engagement marks an important step toward establishing meaningful international partnerships that support resilient and sustainable water systems.

RSU Launches LIBRO and ZODWAY to Support Water Access and Community Learning

With the theme “Building Resilient MIMAROPA: AI & Renewable Energy for a Sustainable Future,” the conference highlighted innovative works advancing clean and sustainable energy solutions.



RSU Strengthens Renewable Energy Governance Through MOA with ROMELCO

Romblon State University reinforced its administrative commitment to clean and sustainable energy by signing a Memorandum of Agreement with the Romblon Electric Cooperative (ROMELCO) on February 6, 2023, in support of the Renewable Energy Exploitation and Suitability Assessment (REESA) Project. The collaboration focuses on evaluating Sibuyan Island's potential for solar and wind energy development, bringing together technical expertise, scientific research, and institutional support.

Through this partnership, RSU plays a vital leadership role in advancing renewable energy initiatives in the province. The project strengthens local energy planning, promotes evidence-based decision making, and contributes to long-term energy sustainability for Sibuyan Island communities.



RSU Revives Marble NICER Program Through DOST and UA&P Collaboration

Romblon State University strengthened its research initiatives by meeting with the Department of Science and Technology (DOST) and the University of Asia and the Pacific (UA&P) to relaunch the Marble NICER Program. 


